# 3-A Storing Phone Numbers in Memory

You can store up to 10 phone numbers in the handset. The dialing buttons (0) to 9) function as memory stations. The IN USE indicator light must be off before programming.

**9** Press a memory station number (**0** to **9**).



# 4-A For Call Waiting Service Users

Press /FLASH if you hear a call-waiting tone while talking.

## 4-B Automatic Security Code Setting

Each time you place the handset on the base unit, the unit automatically selects one of 65,000 security codes. These codes help prevent the unauthorized use of your telephone line by another cordless telephone user.

# 4-C Temporary Tone Dialing (For Rotary or Pulse Service Users)

Press **TONE** before entering access numbers which require tone dialing.

•The dialing mode changes to tone. You can enter numbers to access an answering service, electronic banking service, etc. When you hang up, the mode will return to pulse.

# 4-D How to Use the PAUSE Button (For Analog PBX Line/Long Distance Service Users)

We recommend you press **PAUSE/REDIAL** if a pause is required for dialing with a PBX or to access a long distance service.

Ex: Line access number (9) (PBX)

- 9 → PAUSE/REDIAL → Phone number
- Pressing (PAUSE/REDIAL) once creates a 3 second pause. This prevents misdialing when you redial or dial a stored number.
- Pressing (PAUSE/REDIAL) more than once increases the length of the pause between numbers.

#### 4-E Handset Locator

You can locate the handset or page the handset user with beep tones from the base unit.

- Press HANDSET LOCATOR on the base unit.
  - The IN USE/CHARGE indicator flashes and the handset beeps for 2 minutes.
- 2 To stop paging, press (HANDSET LOCATOR) again or press (OFF) on the handset.


# 5-A Battery

## Recharge

If the unit beeps and then the IN USE indicator flashes slowly when you press //FLASH) or while talking, the call will be disconnected within about 3 minutes after the beep sounds.

If the unit produces a continuous beep, it will not be able to operate.

Place the handset on the base unit to recharge the battery for 15 hours.


After your Panasonic battery is fully charged:

While not in use (Standby)	Up to about 5 days

- The battery operating time may vary depending on usage conditions and ambient temperature.
- Clean the handset and the base unit charge contacts with a soft, dry cloth once a month. Clean more often if the unit is subject to grease, dust or high humidity. Otherwise the battery may not charge properly.
- If the battery is fully charged, you do not have to place the handset on the base unit until the IN USE indicator flashes. This will maximize the battery


# 5-C Wall Mounting

This unit can be mounted on a wall phone plate.

Remove the wall mounting adaptor.




Push the lower side of the hook (①) and pull down the hook until it locks (②), so the tab holds the handset.





## 5-D Battery Replacement

If the IN USE indicator flashes after being fully charged, replace the battery with a new Panasonic P-P504 battery. To order, call the accessories telephone number in section 1-A.

Press the notch on the handset cover firmly (1) and slide it as indicated by the arrow (2).



- Remove the old battery.
  Then install the new one.
  - Insert the battery plug into the connector as shown in the picture.
  - Be sure wires are free from being pressed by the battery body or handset cover.








